

**Kerry San Chirico, PhD** (Associate Professor, Villanova University; Member, St George Antiochian Church, Upper Darby): Professor San Chirico is Associate Professor of Theology and Religious Studies and specializes in Global Christianities and South Asian religions. He received his doctorate in South Asian Religions from UC Santa Barbara in 2012 and holds master's degrees from Princeton Seminary, Rutgers University, St Vladimir's Orthodox Theological Seminary, and Boston College.

Having returned from her theological studies in Boston, from 2011-2019 she worked for the All Africa Conference of Churches (AACC) at the Docket of Youth and Children's Ministry within the Department of Theology, Family Life and Gender Justice. She continues to lead seminars and workshops in Nairobi.

**Rev Sujit Thomas** (Associate Priest, St Thomas Indian Orthodox Church, Philadelphia): Fr Sujit Thomas is a graduate of Columbia University, Orthodox Theological Seminary (Kottayam, India), Union Theological Seminary (NY), and St Vladimir's Orthodox Theological Seminary. Fr Sujit is presently a 3<sup>rd</sup> year doctoral student at Villanova University where he studies the Bible and its reception in the first centuries of Christian era. Fr Sujit is also serving as Assistant Vicar of St Thomas Indian Orthodox Church, Philadelphia (Unruh Ave.). St Thomas Church is the largest church in Northeast Diocese of Malankara Church and is composed of over 225 families (over 700 members). Previously, he served in Albany, NY where the Malankara Church had close relations with St George Antiochian Orthodox Church, Albany. Fr Sujit resides in Havertown.
